


6 in 1000 people are homeless in Sacramento County^{1,2}









*Have experienced homelessness for at least a year while struggling with a disabling condition






58,383 affordable rental homes are needed to meet the current demand.⁴




Permanent Housing






2,718 people achieved permanent housing

— turnover rates are low for permanent housing inventory and many people achieve permanent housing outside the Homeless Response System.

People Experiencing Homelessness⁸



According to HMIS, the number of people experiencing homelessness has increased in the last 5 years while the count of those experiencing homelessness for the first-time decreased.

Exits to Permanent Housing⁸



The percent of people exiting homelessness to permanent housing has decreased in the last 5 years.

Returns to Homelessness⁸



The percent of people returning to homelessness within 12 months **remained stable** in the last 5 years.
