


## **ADVOCACY**

15 testimonies

Testified to City Council & Board of Supervisors <u>15 times</u> on homeless and food insecurity issues

SB1152

Co-sponsored with CA Pan- Ethnic Health Network
SB1152 – Hospital Patient Discharge Process: Homeless
Patients – effective 1/1/2019
Goal is to stop hospitals from discharging homeless
patients "to the streets"

Measure U: \$47 million annually

SRCEH supported Measure U on the City's November 2018 ballot – will provide \$47 million annually for homeless and affordable housing

Preliminary Injunction to City's Panhandling Ordinance

Homeless Civil Rights Project:
Advocacy to protect the civil rights of people
experiencing homelessness

Access to bathrooms and Mobile Shower program Based on our report: <u>Dignity Denied</u>, City Council voted to expand access to bathrooms for people experiencing homelessness and support a Mobile Shower program



5 on \$5.00/day Mayor Steinberg and four city council members signed the Food Stamp Challenge Pledge to try to live on \$5.00/day for a week as part of National Hunger & Homelessness Awareness Week

#### SRCEH's Neighborhood YIMBY Campaign

#### Mayor's Challenge

In late 2018, Mayor Steinberg challenged each city councilmember to site at least 100 emergency shelter beds in their district – or a combination of shelter beds and tiny homes – for a total of at least 800 new emergency shelter beds to keep homeless people safe.

#### **SRCEH's Response**

SRCEH knows that city councilmembers trying to respond to the Mayor's challenge will face a combination of NIMBY [Not In My Back Yard]; CAVE [Citizens Against Virtually Everything] and Banana [Build Absolutely Nothing Anywhere Near Anything] mentalities.

Our campaign goal is to sign up at least 100 community members in each of the 8 city council districts for our **Neighborhood YIMBY Council's Campaign:**







<u>124 deaths</u> of people experiencing homelessness in 2017 for a 15 year total of 900 deaths <u>or</u> 1 death every 6 days

#### **Dignity Denied**




SRCEH report – analysis of 205 city parks – only 38 or 18.5% had bathrooms – our study found 7 of these locked – in 4 areas that have the highest concentration of people experiencing homelessness

Led to City Council supporting a "Portland Loo" in Downtown and working with Regional Transit to create a Mobile Shower program – modeled after Lava Mae program in San Francisco, Oakland and Los Angeles

People's Guide to Health, Welfare & Other Services:
Sacramento County: Distributed 15,000 copies in
English & Spanish to homeless & low income people



SRCEH partnered with Sacramento Steps Forward, United Way, Sacramento Central Labor Council and SacSOS, with funding from Kaiser, Rabobank, N.A., Sacramento Central Labor Council, SMUD, Sutter Health, Teichert Foundation and Wells Fargo to research, write and produce the *People's Guide to Health, Welfare & Other Services: Sacramento County.* The *Guide* is 70% self-advocacy guide – 30% directory - for homeless & low-income people covering: shelter, housing, food; health care, mental health & substance abuse treatment; income, employment; transportation; utilities; clothing; guide for non-citizens.


